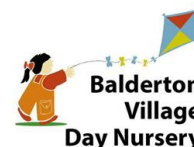


Newsletter – October 2025

Tax Free Childcare-

We would like to let you all know about Tax Free childcare, working parents with children aged 11 and under can be entitled to up to £2,000 per child, per year towards childcare costs. For every £8 you pay into your account the government will top up with an extra £2. To apply or see if you are eligible visit the Gov website and search for Tax Free childcare. If you have any other questions, please ask and we will try our best to steer you in the right direction.





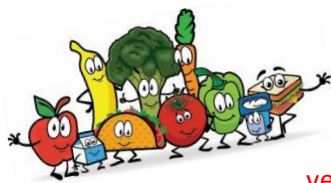
Flintham Show-
